We Love Wood!

A few years ago, we were able to make 13 STUVA storage boxes from the wood of one tree. Today one tree is enough for 23 STUVA storage boxes. How did we do it? With board on stiles technology, a new way to get more out of our wood by adding air to make it more lightweight and resource-efficient.

"Filling the whole product with solid material is wasteful and a misuse of materials. In addition, we can make furniture with thick boards [but it doesn't have to be] from solid wood-based boards." Says Johan Ejdemo, IKEA Material and Technical Development Manager. Today production waste is minimized efficiently and IKEA is constantly investing in new materials and production methods so as to use even less in the future, at lower prices. "It may be more or less trendy, and different woods may be more or less attractive at different times. But man will always have a need for nature." says Ejdemo.
