Safety information

For your safety

- Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door open since this can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy. It is important not to break or tamper with the safety interlocks.
- Do not place any object between the oven front face and the door or allow soil or cleaner residue to accumulate on sealing surfaces.
- ▲ **WARNING!** If the door or door seals are damaged, the oven must not be operated until it has been repaired by a qualified technician.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING

To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, injury to persons or exposure to excessive microwave oven energy when using your appliance, follow basic precautions, including the following:

- Read and follow the specific: "PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY".
- This device can be used by children aged 8
 and older, and by individuals with reduced
 physical, sensory, or mental capabilities,
 or those lacking experience or knowledge,
 provided they are given proper

- instructions on the safe use of the device and understand the associated risks.
- Keep the appliance and its cord out of reach of children less than 8 years.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

- When heating food in plastic or paper containers, keep an eye on the oven due to the possibility of ignition.

- If smoke is emitted, switch off or unplug the appliance and keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames.
- Microwave heating of beverages can result in delayed eruptive boiling, therefore care must be taken when handling the container.
- The contents of feeding bottles and baby food jars shall be stirred or shaken and the temperature checked before consumption, in order to avoid burns.
- Eggs in their shell and whole hard-boiled eggs should not be heated in microwave ovens since they may explode, even after microwave heating has ended.
- The oven should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits removed.

- Failure to maintain the oven in a clean condition could lead to deterioration of the surface that could adversely affect the life of the appliance and possibly result in a hazardous situation.
- The appliance must not be installed behind a decorative door in order to avoid overheating.
- Only use the temperature probe recommended for this oven.
 (For ovens provided with a facility to use a temperature-sensing probe.)
- The microwave oven shall not be placed in a cabinet unless it has been tested in a cabinet.
- The microwave oven must be operated with the decorative door open. (For ovens with a decorative door.)
- This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as:
 - staff kitchen areas in shops, offices and other working environments;
 - by clients in hotels, motels and other residential type environments;
 - farm houses;
 - bed and breakfast type environments.
- The microwave oven is intended for heating food and beverages. Drying of food or clothing and heating of warming pads, slippers, sponges, damp cloth and similar may lead to risk of injury, ignition or fire. Metallic containers for food and beverages must not be used as the may ignite. The appliance is intended to be used freestanding. To avoid overheating do not install in a cabinet or behind a decorative door.
- The appliance shall not be cleaned with a steam cleaner.
- The appliance is intended to be used freestanding.
- The rear surface of appliances shall be placed against a wall.
- The appliances are not intended to be operated by means of an external timer or separate remote-control system.

 The temperature of accessible surfaces may be high when the appliance is operating.

This appliance must be grounded. In the event of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces the risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current. This appliance is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into an outlet that is properly installed and grounded.

Consult a qualified electrician or serviceman if the grounding instructions are not completely understood or if doubt exists as to whether the appliance is properly grounded. If it is necessary to use an extension cord, use only a 3-wire extension cord.

CLEANING

Be sure to unplug the appliance from the power supply.

- Clean the cavity of the oven after using with a slightly damp cloth.
- Clean the accessories in the usual way in soapy water.
- The door frame and seal and neighbouring parts must be cleaned carefully with a damp cloth when they are dirty.
- Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners or sharp metal scrapers to clean the oven door glass since they can scratch the surface, which may result in shattering of the glass.
- Cleaning Tip ★ For easier cleaning of the cavity walls that the food cooked can touch: Place half a lemon in a bowl, add 300ml (1/2 pint) water and heat on 100% microwave power for 10 minutes. Wipe the oven clean using a soft, dry cloth.

Utensil Test:

- Fill a microwave-safe container with 1 cup of cold water (250ml) along with the utensil in question.
- Cook on maximum power for 1 minute.
- Carefully feel the utensil. If the empty utensil is warm, do not use it for microwave cooking.
- Do not exceed 1 minute cooking time.

Materials you can use in microwave oven

Utensils	Remarks
Browning dish	Follow manufacturer's instructions. The bottom of browning dish must be at least 5 mm (3/16 inch), above the turntable. Incorrect usage may cause the turntable to break.
Dinnerware	Microwave-safe only. Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Glass jars	Always remove lid. Use only to heat food until just warm. Most glass jars are not heat resistant and may break.
Glassware	Heat-resistant oven glassware only. Make sure there is no metallic trim. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Oven cooking bags	Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not close with metal tie. Make slits to allow steam to escape.
Paper plates and cups	Use for short-term cooking/warming only. Do not leave oven unattended while cooking.
Paper towels	Use to cover food for reheating and absorbing fat. Use with supervision for a short-term cooking only.
Parchment paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering or a wrap for steaming.
Plastic	Microwave-safe only. Follow the manufacturer's instructions. Should be labeled "Microwave Safe". Some plastic containers soften, as the food inside gets hot. "Boiling bags" and tightly closed plastic bags should be slit, pierced or vented as directed by package.
Plastic wrap	Microwave-safe only. Use to cover food during cooking to retain moisture. Do not allow plastic wrap to touch food.
Thermometers	Microwave-safe only (meat and candy thermometers).
Wax paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering and retain moisture.

Utensils	Remarks
Aluminum tray	May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.
Food carton with metal handle	May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.
Metal or metal- trimmed utensils	Metal shields the food from microwave energy. Metal trim may cause arcing.
Metal twist ties	May cause arcing and could cause a fire in the oven.
Paper bags	May cause a fire in the oven.
Plastic foam	Plastic foam may melt or contaminate the liquid inside when exposed to high temperature.
Wood	Wood will dry out when used in the microwave oven and may split or crack.





- Air Fry Basket: Do not use this in the solo microwave function. It should be placed on the glass tray when used in a suitable function according to above table.
- Grill Tray: Do not use this in the solo microwave function. It should be placed on the glass tray when used in a suitable function according to above table.


Turntable installation

- b) Both glass tray and turntable ring assembly must always be used during cooking.
- c) All food and containers of food are always placed on the glass tray for cooking.
- d) If glass tray or turntable ring assembly cracks or breaks, contact your nearest authorized service center.

Setting the clock

- (1) Press "(-1)" once and then "00:00" will display.
- (2) Press the number keys to enter the time. Example: To set the clock to 12:10, please press "1, 2, 1, 0" in turn.

(3) Press " \bigcirc " to confirm. The clock is set.

Notes:

- (1) To reset the clock, please repeat step 1 to step 3.
- (2) The clock is a 24-hour display. If the clock is not set, it will not work when powered.

Setting the kitchen timer

- (1) Press "(J)" twice and then "0:00" will display.
- (2) Press the number keys to set the desired time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (3) Press " to confirm. The timer starts counting down.

- (1) Press "____" once, "P100" will display.
- (2) Press "_____" repeatedly or press the number keys to set the power level. The 10 power levels are available.
- (3) Press " $\sum_{\text{+30}}$ " to confirm.
- (4) Press the number keys to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (5) Press " \downarrow_{+30} " to start cooking.

Defrost by weight

- (1) Press " $\frac{1}{6}$ " once and then the screen will display "dEF1".
- (2) Press the number keys to set the weight of the food. The range of weight is 100~2000g.
- (3) Press " b_{+30} " to start defrosting.

Note:

The buzzer will sound to remind you to turn the food over during defrosting. If no operation, the oven will continue working.

Defrost by time

(1) Press " $\overset{\times}{\circ}$ " twice and then the screen will display "dEF2".

- (2) Press the number keys to set the desired defrosting time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (3) Press " \bigvee_{START} to start defrosting.

Notes:

- (1) The buzzer will sound to remind you to turn the food over during defrosting. If no operation, the oven will continue working.
- (2) The default power level is P30 and it cannot be changed.

Grill cooking

- (1) Press "▼▼" once and then "G" will display.
- (2) Press the number keys to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (3) Press " $\stackrel{1}{\triangleright}_{130}$ " to start cooking.

Note:

The buzzer will sound to remind you to turn the food over during grilling. If no operation, the oven will continue working.

Air fry cooking (with preheating & without preheating)

- (1) Press "" once, and then "150°C" will display.
- (2) Press "" repeatedly to set the temperature. The 10 options are available, including 150°C, 160°C, 170°C, 180°C, 190°C, 200°C, 210°C, 220°C, 230°C, 240°C.
- (3) Press " to confirm the temperature.
- (4) Press "\(\sigma_{\text{370}''}\) again to start preheating. When preheating is completed, the oven will beep twice. Open the door and place the food in the oven. Then close the door. (If preheating is not needed, please skip this step.)
- (5) Press the number keys to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (6) Press $^{"}_{\text{START}}$ to start cooking.

Microwave+convection (Combination cooking)

- (1) Press "∑" once and then "C-1" will display.
- (2) Press the number keys to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (3) Press " $^{+30}$ " to start cooking.

Microwave+grill (Combination cooking)

- (1) Press "♥ once and then "C-2" will display.
- (2) Press the number keys to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (3) Press " $\underset{\text{start}}{\triangleright}_{+30}$ " to start cooking.

Multi-stage cooking

Notes:

- (1) Two cooking stages can be set in multi-stage cooking.
- (2) If you set the defrost function, it will work automatically in the first stage.
- (3) The kitchen timer, auto menu, preheating and speedy cooking cannot be set as one of the multi-stage.

Example: Defrost food for 5 minutes and then grill food for 7 minutes.

- (1) Press " $\frac{1}{6}$ " twice and then the screen will display "dEF2".
- (2) Press "5", "0", and "0" to set the desired defrosting time to 5 minutes.
- (3) Press "▼▼" once and then "G" will display.
- (4) Press "7", "0", and "0" to set the cooking time to 7 minutes.
- (5) Press " to start cooking.

Speedy cooking

- (1) In standby mode, pressing the number keys 1 to 6 lets you quickly select a cooking time from 1 to 6 minutes. Then you can press "\(\sigma_{330}\)" to increase the cooking time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (2) In standby mode, press " to cook food at 100% power level for 30 seconds. Each press on the same key can increase 30 seconds and the maximum time value is "99:99".

Notes:

In the microwave, grill, air fry combination, and defrost by time state, each one more press on " $^{\downarrow}_{530}$ " can increase the cooking time by 30 seconds. (Except for the defrost by weight.)

Warm up tea, coffee

- (1) Press " \bigcirc " once and then "1" will display.
- (2) Press " repeatedly and then "1", 2", or "3" will display in order.
- (3) Press " $^{+30}$ " to start cooking.

Lock function for children

You can use this function to disable the screen buttons and prevent your child from accidentally turning the oven on.

To activate the lock:

In standby mode, press and hold " \bigcirc " for three seconds. A beep sounds and the locked icon will display.

To deactivate the lock:

In the locked state, press and hold " \bigcirc " for three seconds. A beep sounds.

Mute mode

To activate the mute mode:

In standby mode, press and hold "8" for three seconds. "OFF" will display. When you press the key, it does not make a sound.

To deactivate the mute mode:

In mute mode, press and hold "8" for three seconds. The buzzer will sound and "On" will display.

Eco function

To enter ECO mode:

In standby mode, press "Once. The screen will turn off.

To cancel ECO mode:

In ECO mode, pressing any key, or opening and closing the door will cancel it.

Inquiring function

- (1) If the clock has been set, the current time will display for three seconds by pressing "①" in the cooking state.
- (2) In the microwave cooking state, press " to inquire about the power level. The grill, convection, and combination cooking state, press the corresponding keys to inquire about the cooking temperature, or cooking mode.

Trouble shooting

Normal	
Microwave oven interfering TV reception	Radio and TV reception may be interfered when microwave oven operating. It is similar to the interference of small electrical appliances, like mixer, vacuum cleaner, electric fan. It is normal.
Dim oven light	In low power microwave cooking, oven light may become dim. It is normal.
Steam accumulating on door, hot air out of vents.	In cooking, steam may come out of food. Most will get out from vents, but some may accumulate on cool place like oven door. It is normal.
Oven started accidentally with no food in.	It is forbidden to run the unit without any food inside. It is very dangerous.

Trouble	Possible cause	Remedy
Oven can not be started.	(1) Power cord not plugged tightly.	Unplug. Then unplug again after 10 seconds.
	(2) Fuse blowing or circuit breaker works.	Replace fuse or reset curcuit breaker (repaired by professional personnel of our company)
	(3) Trouble with outlet.	Test outlet with other electrical appliances.
Oven does not heat	(4) Door not closed well.	Close door well.


Countertop Installation

Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. Do not install if oven is damaged.

Cabinet: Remove any protective film found on the microwave oven cabinet surface. Do not remove the light brown Mica cover that is attached to the oven cavity to protect the magnetron.

Installation

 Select a level surface that provide enough open space for the intake and/or outlet vents.



- The minimum installation height is 85 cm.
- The rear surface of appliance shall be placed against a wall.
 Leave a minimum clearance of 30 cm above the oven, a minimum clearance of 20 cm is required between the oven and any adjacent walls.
- Do not remove the legs from the bottom of the oven.

- Blocking the intake and/or outlet openings can damage the oven.
- Place the oven as far away from radios and TV as possible. Operation of microwave oven may cause interference to your radio or TV reception.
- Plug your oven into a standard household outlet. Be sure the voltage and the frequency is the same as the voltage and the frequency on the rating label.

The guarantee covers faults of the appliance, which have been caused by faulty construction or material faults from the date of purchase from IKEA. This guarantee applies to domestic use only.

The products have been designed and tested for domestic purposes only and this guarantee does not cover damage arising from use of the Product in a commercial environment.

The exceptions are specified under the headline "What is not covered under this guarantee?" Within the guarantee period, the costs to remedy the fault e.g. repairs, parts, labour and travel will be covered, provided that the appliance is accessible for repair without special expenditure. Replaced parts become the property of IKEA.

The guarantee exists only if the appliance complies and is installed in accordance with:

What is not covered under this guarantee?

However, if an IKEA service provider or its authorized service partner repairs or replaces the appliance under the terms of this guarantee, the service provider or its authorized service partner will re-install the repaired appliance or install the replacement, if necessary.
- The appliance's serial number or warranty seal has been removed or defaced.

You are entitled to a replacement or refund for a major failure and compensation for any other reasonably foreseeable loss or damage.
