# **A Safety information**

Before the installation and use of the appliance, carefully read the supplied instructions. The manufacturer is not responsible if an incorrect installation and use causes injuries and damages. Always keep the instructions with the appliance for future reference.

# Children and vulnerable people safety

- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning the use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.
- Do not let children play with the appliance.
- Keep all packaging away from children and dispose of it appropriately.
- Keep children and pets away from the appliance when it operates or when it cools down. Accessible parts are hot.
- If the appliance has a child safety device, this should be activated.

 Children shall not carry out cleaning and user maintenance of the appliance without supervision.

 Children aged 3 years and under must be kept away from this appliance when it is in operation at all times.

# **General Safety**

- Only a qualified person must install this appliance and replace the cable.
- WARNING: The appliance and its accessible parts become hot during use. Care should be taken to avoid touching heating elements. Children less than 8 years of age shall be kept away unless continuously supervised.
- Always use oven gloves to remove or put in accessories or ovenware.
- Before maintenance cut the power supply.
- Ensure that the appliance is switched off before replacing the lamp to avoid the possibility of electric shock.
- Do not use a steam cleaner to clean the appliance.
- Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners or sharp metal scrapers to clean the glass door since they can scratch the surface, which may result in shattering of the glass.
- If the mains power supply cable is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its Authorised Service Centre or similarly qualified persons to avoid an electrical hazard.
- To remove the shelf supports first pull the front of the shelf support and then the rear end away from the side walls.
   Install the shelf supports in the opposite sequence.
- The means for disconnection must be incorporated in the fixed wiring in accordance with the wiring rules.

# **Conditions of Use**

This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as:

# Safety instructions

#### Installation



**Warning!** Only a qualified person must install this appliance.

- Remove all the packaging.
- Do not install or use a damaged appliance.
- Follow the installation instruction supplied with the appliance.
- Always take care when moving the appliance as it is heavy. Always use safety gloves and enclosed footwear.
- Do not pull the appliance by the handle.
- Keep the minimum distance from the other appliances and units.
- Make sure that the appliance is installed below and adjacent safe structures.
- The sides of the appliance must stay adjacent to appliances or to units with the same height.

#### **Electrical connection**



**Warning!** Risk of fire and electrical shock.

- All electrical connections should be made by a qualified electrician.
- The appliance must be earthed.
- Make sure that the parameters on the rating plate are compatible with the electrical ratings of the mains power supply.
- Always use a correctly installed shockproof socket.
- Do not use multi-plug adapters and extension cables.
- Make sure not to cause damage to the mains plug and to the mains cable.
   Should the mains cable need to be replaced, this must be carried out by our Authorised Service Centre.

- Do not let mains cables touch or come near the appliance door, especially when the door is hot.
- The shock protection of live and insulated parts must be fastened in such a way that it cannot be removed without tools.
- Connect the mains plug to the mains socket only at the end of the installation.
   Make sure that there is access to the mains plug after the installation.
- If the mains socket is loose, do not connect the mains plug.
- Do not pull the mains cable to disconnect the appliance. Always pull the mains plug.
- Use only correct isolation devices: line protecting cut-outs, fuses (screw type fuses removed from the holder), earth leakage trips and contactors.
- The electrical installation must have an isolation device which lets you disconnect the appliance from the mains at all poles. The isolation device must have a contact opening width of minimum 3 mm.

#### Use



**Warning!** Risk of injury, burns and electrical shock or explosion.

- This appliance is for household use only.
- Do not change the specification of this appliance.
- Make sure that the ventilation openings are not blocked.
- Do not let the appliance stay unattended during operation.
- Deactivate the appliance after each use.
- Be careful when you open the appliance door while the appliance is in operation. Hot air can release.
- Do not operate the appliance with wet hands or when it has contact with water.
- Do not apply pressure on the open door.

- Do not use the appliance as a work surface or as a storage surface.
- Open the appliance door carefully. The use of ingredients with alcohol can cause a mixture of alcohol and air.
- Do not let sparks or open flames to come in contact with the appliance when you open the door.
- Do not put flammable products or items that are wet with flammable products in, near or on the appliance.

**Warning!** Risk of damage to the appliance.

- To prevent damage or discoloration to the enamel:
  - do not put ovenware or other objects in the appliance directly on the bottom.
  - do not put aluminium foil directly on the bottom of cavity of the appliance.
  - do not put water directly into the hot appliance.
  - do not keep moist dishes and food in the appliance after you finish the cooking.
  - be careful when you remove or install the accessories.
- Discoloration of the enamel or stainless steel has no effect on the performance of the appliance.
- Use a deep pan for moist cakes. Fruit juices cause stains that can be permanent.
- This appliance is for cooking purposes only. It must not be used for other purposes, for example room heating.
- Always cook with the oven door closed.
- If the appliance is installed behind a furniture panel (e.g. a door) make sure the door is never closed when the appliance is in operation. Heat and moisture can build up behind a closed furniture panel and cause subsequent damage to the appliance, the housing unit or the floor. Do not close the

furniture panel until the appliance has cooled down completely after use.

#### **Care and Cleaning**



**Warning!** Risk of injury, fire, or damage to the appliance.

- Before maintenance, deactivate the appliance and disconnect the mains plug from the mains socket.
- Make sure the appliance is cold. There is a risk that the glass panels can break.
- Replace immediately the door glass panels when they are damaged. Contact the Authorised Service Centre.
- Be careful when you remove the door from the appliance. The door is heavy!
- Clean regularly the appliance to prevent the deterioration of the surface material.
- Fat and food remaining in the appliance can cause fire.
- If you use an oven spray, obey the safety instructions on the packaging.

#### Internal light

 The type of light bulb or halogen lamp used for this appliance is only for household appliances. Do not use it for house lighting.



Warning! Risk of electrical shock.

- Before replacing the lamp, disconnect the appliance from the power supply.
- Only use lamps with the same specifications.

#### Disposal



**Warning!** Risk of injury or suffocation.

- Disconnect the appliance from the mains supply.
- Cut off the mains electrical cable close to the appliance and dispose of it.
- Remove the door to prevent children and pets to get closed in the appliance.



# Before first use

# **Initial Cleaning**

Remove all accessories and removable shelf supports from the appliance.



Refer to "Care and cleaning" chapter.

Clean the appliance and the accessories before first use.

Put the accessories and the removable shelf supports back to their initial position.

#### **Preheating**

Preheat the empty appliance before first use.

- 1. Set the function and the maximum temperature.
- 2. Let the appliance operate for 1 hour.
- 3. Set the function and set the maximum temperature.
- **4.** Let the appliance operate for 15 minutes.

Accessories can become hotter than usual. The appliance can emit an odour and smoke. This is normal. Make sure that the airflow in the room is sufficient.

#### Using the Mechanical child lock


The appliance has the child lock installed and activated. It is below the control panel on the right side.

To open the oven door with the child lock installed, pull the child lock handle up as shown in the picture.



Close the oven door without pulling the child lock.

To remove the child lock, open the oven door and remove the child lock with the torx key. The torx key is in the oven fitting bag.



Screw back the screw into the hole after removing the child lock.

# Daily use

#### Retractable knobs

To use the appliance, press the control knob. The control knob comes out.

#### Activating and deactivating the appliance

 Turn the knob for the oven functions clockwise to an oven function.

#### Oven functions

#### **Heat-up indicator**

When you activate an oven function, the bars in the display  $\hat{\xi}$  come on one by one.

The bars show that the oven temperature increases or decreases.

#### Setting and changing the time

After the first connection to the mains, wait until the display shows **hr** and "12:00". "12" flashes.

- 1. Press + or to set the hours.
- 2. Press to confirm and switch to set the minutes.

The display shows **min** and the set hour. "**00**" flashes.

- 3. Press + or to set the current minutes.
- Press to confirm or the set time of day will be saved automatically after 5 seconds.

The display shows the new time.

To change the time of day press again and again until the indicator for the time of day again the display.

# Setting the DURATION function during cooking function

- 1. Press again and again until starts to flash. starts
- 2. Press + or to set the minutes and then the hours for DURATION time.

  Press 1 to confirm.

When the time ends an acoustic signal sounds for 2 minutes.  $\rightarrow$  and time setting

flash in the display. The appliance deactivates automatically.

**3.** Press any button to stop the acoustic signal.

# Setting the END function during cooking function

- Press <sup>1</sup> again and again until → starts to flash.
- 2. Press + or to set the hours and then the minutes for END time. Press 1 to confirm.

At the set time an acoustic signal sounds for 2 minutes.  $\rightarrow$  and time setting flash in the display. The appliance deactivates automatically.

**3.** Press any button to stop the acoustic signal.

#### **Setting the TIME DELAY function**

- Press ⊕ again and again until → starts to flash.
- Press + or to set the minutes and then the hours for DURATION time.
   Press to confirm.

The display shows flashing  $\rightarrow$ .

 Press + or - to set the hours and then the minutes for END time. Press to confirm.

Appliance turns on automatically later on, works for the set DURATION time and stops at the set END time. At the set time an acoustic signal sounds for 2 minutes. 

and time setting flash in the display. The appliance deactivates.

**4.** Press any button to stop the acoustic signal.

#### **Setting the MINUTE MINDER**

- 1. Press again and again until and "00" flash in the display.
- Press + or to set the MINUTE MINDER.
   First you set the seconds, then the minutes.

When the time you set is longer than 60 minutes, **hr** flash in the display.

- 3. Set the hours.
- The MINUTE MINDER starts automatically after 5 seconds. After 90% of the set time, an acoustic signal sounds.
- 5. When the set time ends, an acoustic signal sounds for 2 minutes. "00:00" and 

  flash in the display. Press any button to stop the acoustic signal.

#### **COUNT UP TIMER**

Press again and again until the display shows time without any symbols.

# Using the accessories



#### Inserting the accessories


Wire shelf:

Push the shelf between the guide bars of the shelf support and make sure that the feet point down.




Baking tray / Deep pan:

Push the baking tray / deep pan between the guide bars of the shelf support.



Wire shelf and baking tray / deep pan together:

Push the baking tray / deep pan between the guide bars of the shelf support and the wire shelf on the guide bars above.



Small indentation at the top increase safety. The indentations are also anti-tip devices. The high rim around the shelf prevents cookware from slipping of the shelf.


#### Using the telescopic runners

 Keep the installation instructions for the telescopic runners for future use.

With telescopic runners you can put in and remove the shelves more easily.



**Caution!** Do not clean the telescopic runners in the dishwasher. Do not lubricate the telescopic runners.



Pull out the right and left hand telescopic runners. Put the wire shelf on the telescopic runners and carefully push them into the appliance.

Make sure you push back the telescopic runners fully in the appliance before you close the oven door.



You can also use the telescopic runners with the trays or pans supplied with the appliance.

# **Additional functions**

## **Using the Child Lock**

When the Child Lock is on, the appliance cannot be activated accidentally.

- 1. Ensure the knob for the oven functions is in the off position.
- 2. Press and hold and at the same time for 2 seconds.

An acoustic signal sounds. SAFE comes on in the display.

To deactivate the Child Lock, repeat step 2.

#### Automatic switch-off

For safety reasons the appliance deactivates automatically after some time if an oven function operates and you do not change any settings.

After an automatic switch-off, deactivate the appliance fully. Then you can activate it again.



The Automatic switch-off does not work with the functions: Duration, End.

#### Residual heat indicator

When you deactivate the appliance, the display shows the residual heat indicator if the temperature in the oven is more than

40 °C. Turn the knob for the temperature left or right to show the oven temperature.

#### **Cooling fan**

When the appliance operates, the cooling fan activates automatically to keep the surfaces of the appliance cool. If you deactivate the appliance, the cooling fan can continue to operate until the appliance cools down.

#### Safety thermostat

Incorrect operation of the appliance or defective components can cause dangerous overheating. To prevent this, the oven has a safety thermostat which interrupts the power supply. The oven activates again automatically when the temperature drops.

# Hints and tips

#### **General information**

- Use the function Forced Air Cooking to preheat the oven in the fastest way.
- Whenever preheating, remove the wire shelves and trays from the cavity to have the fastest performance.
- The appliance has five shelf positions.
   Count the shelf positions from the bottom of the appliance floor.
- The appliance has a special system which circulates the air and constantly recycles the steam. With this system you can cook in a steamy environment and keep the food soft inside and crusty outside. It decreases the cooking time and energy consumption to a minimum.
- Moisture can condense in the appliance or on the door glass panels. This is normal. Always stand back from the appliance when you open the appliance door while cooking. If you notice moisture inside of the oven, keep the door open for a couple of minutes.

- Clean the moisture after each use of the appliance.
- Do not put the objects directly on the appliance floor and do not put aluminium foil on the components when you cook. This can change the baking results and cause damage to the enamel.

#### **Baking cakes**

- Do not open the oven door before 3/4 of the set cooking time is up.
- If you use two baking trays at the same time, keep one empty level between them.

#### Cooking meat and fish

- Use a deep pan for very fatty food to prevent the oven from stains that can be permanent.
- Leave the meat for approximately 15 minutes before carving so that the juice does not seep out.
- To prevent too much smoke in the oven during roasting, add some water into the

deep pan. To prevent the smoke condensation, add water each time after it dries up.

#### **Cooking times**

Cooking times depend on the type of food, its consistency, and volume.

Initially, monitor the performance when you cook. Find the best settings (heat setting, cooking time, etc.) for your cookware, recipes and quantities when you use this appliance.

# Care and cleaning



**Warning!** Refer to Safety chapters.

#### Notes on cleaning

 Clean the front of the appliance with a soft cloth with warm water and a cleanina agent.

- To clean metal surfaces, use a dedicated cleaning agent.
- · Clean the appliance interior after each use. Fat accumulation or other food remains may result in a fire. The risk is higher for the grill pan.
- Clean stubborn dirt with a special oven cleaner
- Clean all accessories after each use and let them dry. Use a soft cloth with warm water and a cleaning agent.
- If you have nonstick accessories, do not clean them using aggressive agents. sharp-edged objects or a dishwasher. It can cause damage to the nonstick coating.

#### Stainless steel or aluminium appliances

Clean the oven door with a (i)damp cloth or sponge only. Dry it with a soft cloth.

Do not use steel wool, acids or abrasive materials as they can damage the oven surface. Clean the oven control panel with the same precautions.


#### Cleaning the door gasket

- Regularly do a check of the door gasket. The door aasket is around the frame of the oven cavity. Do not use the appliance if the door gasket is damaged. Contact the Service.
- To clean the door gasket, use a soft cloth with warm water and a cleaning agent.


## Removing the shelf supports

To clean the oven, remove the shelf supports.

1. Pull the front of the shelf support away from the side wall.



2. Pull the rear end of the shelf support away from the side wall and remove it.



Install the shelf supports in the opposite sequence.



The retaining pins on the telescopic runners must point to the front.

#### Cleaning the oven door


The oven door has three glass panels. You can remove the oven door and the internal alass panels to clean them.



The oven door can close if you try to remove the glass panels before you remove the oven door.



Caution! Do not use the appliance without the glass panels.




Open the door fully and hold the two door hinges.

Lift and turn the levers on the two hinges.




Close the oven door halfway to the first opening position. Then pull forward and remove the door from its seat. Put the door on a soft cloth on a stable surface.

Hold the door trim (B) on the top edge of the door at the two sides and push inwards to release the clip seal.



Pull the door trim to the front to remove it


Hold the door glass panels by their top edge and carefully pull them out one by one. Start from the top panel. Make sure the glass slides out of the supports completely.



Clean the glass panels with water and soap. Dry the glass panels carefully.

When the cleaning is completed, install the glass panels and the oven door. Do the above steps in the opposite sequence.

Make sure that you put the glass panels (A and B) back in the correct sequence. The first panel (A) has a decorative frame. The screen-printing zone must face the inner side of the door. Make sure that after the installation the surface of the glass panel frame (A) on the screen-printing zones is not rough when you touch it.



Make sure that you install the middle panel of glass in the seats correctly.



#### Replacing the lamp

Put a cloth on the bottom of the interior of the appliance. It prevents damage to the lamp glass cover and the cavity.



Warning! Danger of electrocution! Disconnect the fuse before you replace the lamp. The lamp and the lamp glass cover can be hot.



**Caution!** Always hold the halogen lamp with a cloth to prevent grease residue from burning on the lamp.

- 1. Deactivate the appliance.
- 2. Remove the fuses from the fuse box or deactivate the circuit breaker.
- **3.** Turn the lamp glass cover counterclockwise to remove it.
- 4. Clean the glass cover.
- Replace the oven light bulb with a 40 W, 220 240 V (50 Hz), 350 °C heat resistant oven light bulb (connection type: G9).
- 6. Install the glass cover.
