
- a floor plan with measurements, including dimensions and locations of doors, windows, and fixtures


How to measure

If you have blueprints or technical drawings in .dwg (AutoCAD) or .rvt (Revit) format, those are preferable and you don't need to measure.


Measuring your room isn't difficult, but it is important to have the right measurements: they will be the basis of your design. Take measurements down to the 1/4" and ensure they're legible.




01 Start by measuring the height from floor to ceiling; the length of each wall; and the distances between corners and doorways.



02 Measure the windows and the distance between them and the floor, ceiling, and corners. Measure the free available area (excluding trim, moldings, and frames). Do the same with doors and other openings.



03 Measure everything that stands out in the space: radiators, ducts, pipes, vents, hearths, etc. Note the location of switches and electrical, data, cable, TV, or other outlets.



04 Draw the space in a bird's-eye view and include your measurements of walls, doors, windows, fireplaces, and any builtins. Note which way doors and windows swing.


How to photograph

Prepare the room

Remove clutter and unnecessary items; leave items that help define the room, and anything you would like to keep.

Set the lighting

Take photos in the morning or early evening, when the light is softer and colors may be more accurate. Open your curtains and turn on all lights for maximum brightness.



Take the photos

A short video of the whole space will help as well!


01 Move back as far as possible and zoom out to have the widest view angle.


02 Take pictures in landscape format.

03 Stay straight; use the vertical lines of your room to align the photo.

04 To get a full view of the room take at least: one picture from each corner; one picture of each full wall; one of the floor (to show the flooring); and one of the ceiling.

05 Measure (width × height × depth, in inches) and photograph existing furniture that you would like to keep.
